- Winners will be asked to submit a video acceptance that can be posted on the WACTA website.

Application Criteria:

- Application must be typed. Typeface must be Times 10 pt. or larger. Handwritten applications will not be accepted
- Application answers must fit in the space provided. Additional pages will not be accepted.
- Resume must be typed
- Incomplete applications will not be accepted

CTE Director signing the application must be a current WACTA member.

Applications submitted, that are not signed by a paid WACTA member, WILL NOT be accepted.
