Tips For The Job Hunt*

- Don't Be Shy. Tell everyone you know you are looking for a job Networking pays off!

- Apply for Lots of Jobs. Apply for as many jobs as possible. Keep applying, rather than waiting to hear back from one before you try for another position.
- **Dress Appropriately.** When you are applying in-person for jobs and interviewing, dress appropriately. Dress as if they will interview you on-the-spot.
- **Be Flexible.** Be as flexible as possible when it comes to your availability. The more flexible you are, the more likely you are to get a job offer. Also, know when you're available. Bring a list of the hours you can work with you when you apply in person or go an interview.
- **Follow Up.** Just because the application is online doesn't mean you can't stop by and introduce yourself to the hiring or shift manager. Bring a small card with your name, email, and phone number to introduce yourself. Let them know you applied online and are following up on your application.

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
