Tips For The Job Hunt*

- **Don't Be Shy.** Tell everyone you know you are looking for a job - Networking pays off!
- **Keep an Open Mind.** Don't limit yourself to certain types of jobs. This is a tough market for young job seekers, and you may not be able to find a job doing what you want to do.
- **Create A LinkedIn Account.** Many organizations are looking at what is written on LinkedIn as opposed to the resume.
- **Write a Resume.** A resume, even though it may not be required by employers, can help you stand out from the competition. Even though you may not have much information to include, a resume shows that you're serious about your job search.
- **Apply for Lots of Jobs.** Apply for as many jobs as possible. Keep applying, rather than waiting to hear back from one before you try for another position.
- **Dress Appropriately.** When you are applying in-person for jobs and interviewing, dress appropriately. Dress as if they will interview you on-the-spot.
- **Be Flexible.** Be as flexible as possible when it comes to your availability. The more flexible you are, the more likely you are to get a job offer. Also, know when you're available. Bring a list of the hours you can work with you when you apply in person or go an interview.
- **Follow Up.** Just because the application is online doesn't mean you can't stop by and introduce yourself to the hiring or shift manager. Bring a small card with your name, email, and phone number to introduce yourself. Let them know you applied online and are following up on your application.

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
