

What years count?

- ❖ They ALL count!
- ❖ Grades earned in High School level classes taken during Middle School can go on your permanent high school transcript and be part of your cumulative GPA if you requested it (Algebra I).
- ❖ College Admissions use GPA up through 11th grade to determine eligibility.
- ❖ Seniors have had admissions revoked for letting their grades drop or not taking at least 3 core academic classes that full year.



4 Year College Prep - Minimums

- ❖ 4 years of English (with 3 in Composition & Literature)
- ❖ 3 years of Math, 4 preferred (at least through Algebra II)
- ❖ 3 years of Science, to include Chemistry or Physics
- ❖ 3 years of Social Studies
- ❖ 2 or more consecutive years of the same foreign language (U of W wants 3 years)
- ❖ 1 year of a true Fine, Visual or Performing Art
- ❖ Senior year must include English, Social Studies and a Math or Math-based Science (ie Chemistry or Physics)
- ❖ SBA scores for Placement, SAT and/or ACT scores




2 Year College Prep

- ❖ High School graduation requirements met
- ❖ SAT/ACT are not required for an AA degree
- ❖ Foreign Language is not required for two year degree (can take a language there to qualify for transfer to a 4 year degree program)
- ❖ Math through Algebra II needed !
- ❖ Must pass Smarter Balance tests to start at 100 level courses: SBA Math score at Level 3 or 4
SBA English score at Level 3 or 4

College Cost Comparison

Community Colleges: Tuition / housing + books

All about \$4000 per year / \$7000 to \$9000 + \$1000

4 year Universities: Tuition/ housing + books

CWU	\$5,800 per year / \$9780 + \$1002
EWU	\$6,951 per year / \$10,945 + \$900
U of W	\$10,753 per year / \$11,691 + \$825
WSU	\$10,984 per year / \$11,356 + \$960
U of O	\$33,442 per year / \$12,210 + \$1000

Your GPA is your “first impression” on a College


- ❖ Extra Curricular Involvement

- ❖ Testing- PSAT/ SAT *and/or* ACT
- ❖ Call/visit/connect with Admissions Office
- ❖ Help your child clean up their internet image!!!!!!




AP vs Running Start vs College in HS

- ❖ Students who are looking at highly competitive schools are encouraged to take AP courses
- ❖ Running Start is best if goal is to get AA degree
- ❖ College in HS partner: Central Wash. University
- ❖ All require a mature, self motivated, self disciplined, but not overloaded student who can and will put in 1-2 hours minimum a night on each class!



- ❖ NCAA for Division I schools
- ❖ NAIA for Division II schools
- ❖ Student athletes must meet NCAA/NAIA Eligibility requirements to be eligible to participate in college athletics his or her first year of college.
- ❖ All students who plan to participate in college sports MUST REGISTER with the clearinghouse
